Supervisor Gary Ovitt expresses his disappointment with the failed mediation regarding the Tehachapi Renewable Transmission Project in Chino Hills.

Fourth District Supervisor Gary Ovitt today expressed his disappointment with the failure to reach a mediated solution between the City of Chino Hills and Southern California Edison regarding the Tehachapi Renewable Transmission Project in Chino Hills.

“The City of Chino Hills has been working hard to find an alternative to the current routing of the Tehachapi Renewable Transmission Project and I was hopeful that my residents would get relief through this mediation,” Supervisor Gary Ovitt said. “Now that it is again in front of the California Public Utilities Commission and an administrative law judge, I would urge them to modify their original approval of this project to require that these transmission lines be moved. I have seen the towers from this project in person and until you do so, you cannot fully understand the impact they have on the skyline of Chino Hills and how they loom over so many homes,” Ovitt added.
